Erie MetroParks Reopens Milan Towpath Bridge

Erie MetroParks is excited to announce the completed renovation and reopening of the bridge along the Milan Towpath MetroPark.

Milan, OH, October 25, 2022- Erie MetroParks officials voted to repair the Milan Towpath Bridge in November of 2021, slated for an overhaul in 2022. Due to supply shortages, the project was pushed back from spring to the latter part of summer. Park operations staff were able to repair the headwalls and railings and install new decking on the bridge.

The Milan Towpath Bridge, once a railroad bridge, is now completely renovated and ready for visitors. The bridge is the entrance to a 0.9-mile path, a linear park that follows the path of an early canal and railway.

Erie MetroParks hopes the community will continue to explore the Milan Towpath MetroPark and check out the updated bridge.

About Erie MetroParks- Erie MetroParks was established in 1968 starting with only Osborn MetroPark. Currently, Erie MetroParks has grown to include 13+ parks or preserves. Many of the properties that are managed by the park district are maintained in their natural state in keeping with the role assigned by the Ohio Revised Code. Areas used for active recreation are designed to have minimal impact on the natural environment of the parks. Educational programs are offered year-round for all ages. Each park is unique and allows for a variety of activities for people of all ages.

Ohio Parks and Recreation Association (OPRA) has announced its 2022 Annual Awards of Excellence winners and a number of local agencies have been recognized.

Locally, Erie MetroParks won a 1st place award in the Environmental and Interpretive Programs category for the Erie MetroParks Nature On Wheels (NOW) mobile project.

Erie MetroParks Nature on Wheels (EMP NOW) is a mobile nature unit designed to bring nature education to nontraditional locations within Erie County. EMP NOW is used to transport the park's nature education animals and other programming supplies. The mobile unit is also equipped with soil & water testing kits, digital microscopes, and other resources for birding, insect exploration, tree and mammal identification, and much more!

Program Manager, Mike Hensley, states "We want to bring nature education into areas of Erie County that may not have easy access to our parks. We created EMP NOW with the goal of increasing accessibility for residents within Erie County."

The OPRA Annual Awards of Excellence will be presented at a banquet hosted by the association on January 31, 2023, at the Kalahari Convention Center in Sandusky, Ohio. One first place award winner will be presented with the 2022 Governor's Award for Parks and Recreation, a "best-in-show" award which includes a \$500 contribution to the parks and recreation foundation of the agency winner.

"Parks and recreation professionals throughout Ohio work every day to improve the quality of life of the people they serve," said OPRA Executive Director Woody Woodward. "This effort is a shining example of that kind of work, and we are pleased to be able to present this award."

The awards are judged by a panel of parks and recreation professionals from around Ohio.

Incorporated in 1963, OPRA is a non-profit, public interest organization representing over 2000 professionals and citizen board members striving to provide quality parks and recreation facilities and opportunities for all Ohioans while protecting and preserving Ohio's natural resources, positively impacting local economies and health and wellness of its citizens.






ABOUT UNITED WAY OF ERIE COUNTY

Dear Community Member,

On September 27, 2022 The Alzheimer's Association, Northwest Ohio Chapter gathered community members from Erie County for a community forum. Education on the disease was shared but most importantly, we heard from those dealing with this awful disease and their caregivers. There were 13 people in attendance (including professionals, family caregivers, and those living with the disease) and we heard about the gaps they see in Erie County. The Alzheimer's Association would like to be a part of filling those gaps for those living with Alzheimer's and all Dementia's and their loved ones in the community.

I am sending along our briefing from that day's community forum that lays out what we heard from the group and our plans to help fill the gaps.

If you would like to help fill these gaps, please let me know if you are able to do any of the following:

- Offer 1 hour free of charge respite care to those living with the disease while their caregiver attends the Caregiver Support Group that meets on the first Tuesday of the month from 9:30-10:30am
- Become an Alzheimer's Association Volunteer and co-facilitate an Early Stage Support Group for those living in the early stages of the disease. The Alzheimer's Association provides education, support and training to that volunteer.
- Become an Alzheimer's Association Community Representative Volunteer and attend community meetings and local health fairs to bring awareness to the disease and Alzheimer's Association programs and services.
- 4. Bring an Adult Day Center to Erie County so caregivers are able to drop their loved ones off so they are able to have a break, work, etc. Right now, Erie County residents are being sent to Fremont, Ohio to receive services of an Adult Day Care.
- 5. Also, please let me know if you are a physician who specializes in Alzheimer's and all other Dementia's.

Alzheimer's is relentless, but so are we!
