Election Reflection

Disclaimer: This article reflects only the personal observations of Joe Roman, GSP and ECCOC's Interim Director.

While there is much material out there about the recent November 8th election, we thought a little deeper dive on the impact here locally was in order. So, these are just some observations you might find helpful or at least thought provoking.

The 2022 mid-term elections confirmed a couple of ongoing trends which will impact Erie County and Ohio for at least the next two years if not much longer.

The nation as a whole is closer to a 50-50 dead heat between major political parties then ever in recent memory. At publishing time, it appears that each chamber will be led by a very slim majority which potentially strengthens each individual member's political power since one or two "holdouts" can influence any particular vote dramatically.

Ohio is confirming its place as a leading conservative and/or republican state on almost all fronts. The Legislature in Ohio, along with the Supreme Court have a very strong position on policy making and potential future Governor vetoes should they arise.

Urban voters are not turning out in anywhere near the pace as other areas, especially in rural and smaller communities are voting at sometimes record levels.

Locally, voters were fairly generous in their support for local levies, especially renewal options. Fire, police and school levies throughout most of the region fared well. It will be interesting to watch if that generosity leads to more tax requests in the future.



A ballot issue to grant Perkins Township with additional "home rule" charter provisions as a township suffered the largest defeat, losing by almost a 3:1 margin. It could be that voters there didn't understand the issue or felt that it could result in a local income tax in the near future. Obviously, these possibilities are intertwined but the issue would not have given the local officials an automatic pathway to a local tax increase without several additional steps by the voters.

People to Watch:

Rep. D.J. Swearingen – Who was reelected in the House this year may have a good chance to assume further leadership duties in the General Assembly due to his current tenure.

Congresswoman March Kaptur – Congresswoman Kaptur will become the longest serving female member of the House of Representatives with this election and her seniority has served the region well. This could bode well for our region despite a change in party control.

NASA/Armstrong Research Facility – Representative Anthony Gonzales, from Cleveland, did not seek reelection to Congress which results in Ohio losing one member of the very important Science Committee in the House which plays a crucial role overseeing NASA Glenn/Armstrong. Hopefully, one of the newer members of the House or an existing member, hopefully in the majority, can be convinced to join this important committee.

Lastly, while not an election issue per se here, Eric Wobser's departure to Cuyahoga County as the result of an election for County Executive there, surely creates a crucial void here in Sandusky. Thankfully, the Sandusky Commissioners are moving quickly to fill the void both with the appointment of an interim City Manager and the launch of a permanent search process. Sandusky's momentum over the past decade is sure to attract great, qualified candidates for the position.


